Graduates of the University

Mr Donald Gordon Allen, PGCE 1962. Died on 12 February 2005. After completing a bachelor of Technical Science degree at the University of Manchester he gained his PGCE and taught Chemistry for three years, then worked in sales and marketing at IBM for 28 years. After retiring in 1993 he devoted his time to education, as Chairman of the Board of Queen Mary's College in Basingstoke and as Hampshire County Council's Executive Member for Education. He had served on the county council since 1989.

Miss Christine Ruth Ashworth, BA English 1988. Died on 6 October 2004.

Mr Ian Bennett, BSc Chemistry 1981. Died in 2004.

Ms Lisa Bloxham, BA Sociology 1996. Died in April 2005. She was the partner of James Hamill in the Politics Department.

Dr David Seymour Brown, BSc Special Zoology 1956, PhD Zoology 1959. Died on 25 March 2004. He was an outstanding naturalist who made an important contribution to the taxonomy and systematics of freshwater snails. He had a special interest and love of Africa and much of his work concerned the role these snails play in the disease schistosomiasis. His major scholarly work in this area will be the prime reference for biologists in the future. He was an external staff member of the Medical Research Council from 1959-99 and Scientific Associate of the Natural History Museum from 1999-2004. He had a lifelong interest in music and played piano in a jazz band at Leicester.

Mr Mark David Buzec, BA in Business Studies 1990 (Nene College). He was a teacher in London. He loved travelling and in 1998 disappeared on a back packing trip around Sicily. His body was found on a mountain on the remote volcanic island of Filicudi and was returned to the UK in 2005. The place where he was found is to be renamed Cape Buzec in his memory.

Mr Andrew Fenton, BSc Chemistry 1982. Died 28 March 2004. He was a brilliant scientist in the nuclear industry and a nationally recognised expert in radioactive waste management. His portfolio of work included projects for British Nuclear Fuels, ICI and Nirex.

Mr Len Alfonso Garrison, MA English Local History 1993. Died on 18 February 2003. Historian, poet and educationalist, he was arguably the most important figure in the black British community's exploration and understanding of its history. His work in creating and developing materials based on the experience of African and Caribbean pupils gave a major impetus to the development of a multicultural curriculum in British schools. In collaboration with Middlesex University, his 20-year collection of documents, memorabilia and artefacts helped to create the Archive and Museum of Black History.

Mrs Alison Jane (née Kelly) Gascoigne, BA French and German 1987. Died on 21 June 2004. After graduation she qualified as a solicitor at Manchester Metropolitan University and in 1991 began work in commercial litigation. In 1993, she began working in family law, where she specialised in the area of child protection following family separations. She later specialised in mental health law and in 1999 was admitted to the Law Society's Mental Health Panel.

Mrs Jacqueline Kay (née Harmston) Goodwin, BA Geography 1986.

Dr Pauline Hardiker, BA Social Sciences 1966, MA Sociology 1967. Died in August 2004. She was appointed to a Lectureship in the School of Social Work in 1969 and promoted to a Senior Lectureship in 1986. She retired in 1997 but continued to work as an Associate Teacher until 2000.

Mr John Henry Howard, BSc Combined Science 1943. Died on 4 January 2005.

Mrs Marilyn (née Oldershaw) Jewson, BA Economic and Social History 1993. Died on 13 October 2004.

Mrs Hilary Jean (née Evans) Lyon, BSc Chemistry 1986. Died 15 July 2004 in a diving accident while exploring the wreck of the WWII minelayer Cotavia off the coast of Orkney in Scotland. She was a highly experienced diver and a qualified diving instructor. Her hobbies – diving and walking – had taken her around the world.

Mr Pete McCarthy (Peter Robinson), BA Combined Studies 1972. Died on 6 October 2004. He was a travel writer, broadcaster and comedian, who was inspired to become a writer after reading James Joyce at the age of 14. He was the author of the best-selling book *McCarthy's Bar*, which humorously explored his Irish heritage and won him the newcomer of the year prize at the British Book Awards in 2002, and the sequel *The Road to McCarthy*. He also presented the Channel 4 series *Travelog* and hosted BBC Radio 4 panel show *X Marks The Spot*.

Professor Ian Duncan MacKillop, PhD (French Literary Criticism). Died on 27 May 2004. He read English at Downing College Cambridge, where he studied under FR Leavis and was inspired by him to take up a life of learning and teaching. After completing a PhD on 17th century French criticism at Leicester, he took up a temporary post at Keele University. In 1968 he began a 36-year teaching career at Sheffield University. He is best known for his biography, *FR Leavis: A Life in Criticism* (1995).

The Rev Professor Howard W Marratt, BA Classics 1947. Died on 4 October 2004. He was a Methodist minister and teacher of religious education and classics. In 1962 he was appointed head of the divinity department at Borough Road College Institute of HE at Isleworth and later became deputy principal. As well as a full workload he found time to lecture part-time, undertake part-time consultancy, shape syllabuses, act as an examiner, publish educational research and involve himself in a TV series on world faiths. He was a keen supporter of Leicester City Football Club and Leicestershire County Cricket

Club and loved exploring the Scottish Highlands. He will be remembered for his great sense of humour.

Mr Andrew Nicoll, BSc Biological Sciences 1998. Died on 22 December 2003. He was a helicopter pilot in the Army Air Corps in Northern Ireland and was killed in a crash in Londonderry. He was a member of the Olympic squad for canoeing and had travelled extensively. He was a fun-loving and caring family member.

Ian David Phillips, BA Economic & Social History 1988. Died on 11 September 2003 after a struggle against malignant melanoma.

Mrs Ann Harrison (née Whaley) Pohlig, BA French 1972. Died on 7 July 2004 after a long battle against cancer. She was married to a Lutheran pastor and worked in Cameroon as a Wycliffe Bible Translator.

Miss Rebecca Primavesi, Law LLB 2001. Died in 2004.

Mrs Jane (née Straw) Redfern, BA Social Sciences (Economics) 1973. Died in 2004 after a long battle against cancer. She was the wife of Alastair Redfern, Bishop of Grantham, and a teacher of Economics at Coventry Polytechnic and Badminton School for Girls in Bristol.

Mr Barrie James Roberts, Microbiology (Med) Research 1988. Died in 2004.

Dr Donald Leslie Sabey, PhD Law 1997. Died in 2004.

Mr Raymond Douglas Selden, MA English Local History 1999. Died on 22 January 2003.

Mrs Valerie Susan Shimwell, Certificate in Management 2003. Died on 22 January 2005 after a long struggle against cancer

Mr Philip John Charles Strong, Law LLB 1994. Died on 6 January 2004 at the age of 30.

Mrs Gwendoline Marshall Tullett, PGCE 1966. Died in 2004.

Dr Bryan Wilson, BSc Economics 1952. Died on 9 October 2004. He was one of the world's leading sociologists of religion. His scholarly interests ranged over many fields and his studies of secularisation and religious sects have become classics. After a lectureship in sociology at the

University of Leeds, he was appointed a Reader in Sociology at Oxford in 1962 and in 1963, a Fellow of All Souls. He spent periods as a teacher, examiner and researcher in Africa, America, Asia, Australia and Western Europe.

Members of Staff

Miss Dorothy Bown, Died on 10 October 2004. She joined the University as a Domestic Assistant in the 1960s and became Dining Room Supervisor until her retirement in 1990.

Mrs Sylvia Butler, Died on 20 January 2005. She worked as a Domestic Assistant from 1976-1992.

Mrs Iris Clegg, Died on 26 June 2004. She joined the University in 1975 as Senior Clerk in the Accountant's Office, was promoted to Principal Clerk in 1979 and Chief Clerk in 1987. She retired later that year.

Professor William Cramond, OBE, Died on 7 June 2004. He was the University's first Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Professor of Mental Health from 1972-1975. He left Leicester to become Principal and Vice-Chancellor of Stirling University from 1975-1980, then returned to live in Australia where he became Director of Mental Health Services in New South Wales from 1980-1983, Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Sydney University from 1980-1983 and Flinders University from 1983-1992.

Mr Konrad Elsdon, BA English 1949. Died on 30 January 2004. He became separated from his family, at the age of 17, when they escaped from Nazi oppression in 1939. Within six months he had matriculated in Yorkshire, but was then interned as an enemy alien and transported to a camp in Australia for two years. He turned this situation into a positive experience by organising and teaching study groups – thus beginning his lifelong involvement with adult education.

Dr A K Babette Evans, FSA, FRHistS, Died on 3 May 2005. She joined University College, Leicester in 1946 as an Assistant Lecturer in the Department of History and was promoted to a Lectureship in 1948 and to a Senior Lectureship in 1962. She became Head of Department during the 1970s and was Dean of the Faculty of Arts between 1978-1981. She retired in 1982.

Mr Rupert Hambling Evans, Died in November 2004. He was appointed to an Assistant Lectureship in History at the University College, Leicester in 1947, was promoted to a Lectureship in 1959 and to a Senior Lectureship in 1965 until his retirement in 1986.

Mr Wilfred Flemming, Died on 16 March 2005. He was appointed to a Lectureship in Education at University College, Leicester in 1950 until his retirement in 1975.

Mrs Susan Margaret Greet, Died in 2004. She joined the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery in 1993 as Team Leader (Principal Clerk) of the Trent & Wales Arthroplasty Audit Group. In 1994 she became PA (Chief Clerk) to Professor P Gregg and later Professor J Harper until she retired in 1999.

Mr Don Hall, Died in December 2004. He was Porter/Custodian at Elms Road Houses, and is fondly remembered by former students as "a one-off; a true gentleman of the old school who had a wicked sense of humour and fun; a man of immense kindness, gentleness and integrity."

Mr Michael Anthony Higgins, Died on 16 April 2004. He was an Administrative Assistant, then Assistant Registrar at the University from 1967-1978. He spent his entire career in higher education and was especially interested in widening participation and access to HE. He was the former Chief Executive of the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) and a protagonist of online applications. Outside his career he was Chairman of the Development Committee of Cheltenham International Festivals of Music, Literature and Jazz (1988-2000) and of the Cheltenham Business Partnership (2002). He was a keen sportsman, and loved football and golf.

Mrs Marion Hope, Died on 3 August 2004. She joined the University in 1979 as a Domestic Assistant and later became the Housekeeper in Gilbert Murray and Villiers Halls.

Mr Morris Keith Hopkins, Died in March 2004. He was a historian who revolutionised the approach to ancient history, especially that of imperial Rome. A graduate in classics from King's College, Cambridge, he accepted an assistant lectureship in sociology at Leicester from 1961-1963, then returned to King's as a research fellow from 1963-1967, while at the same time taking a lectureship at the London School of Economics. He was Professor of Ancient History at Cambridge from 1985-2001.

Mrs Joan Hughes, Died on 23 September 2004. She worked as a Cleaner in the Medical Sciences Building from 1977 until her retirement in 1986.

Mr Jim Jerman, Died in May 2004. He joined the University as a Lecturer in the School of Education in 1964 and retired in 1982.

Dr Paris Leary, Died on 13 April 2005. He joined the University's Department of English in 1965 as a Lecturer in American Literature and retired in 1988.

The Venerable Harold Lockley, Died on 26 September 2004. He was a part-time lecturer in Biblical Studies. Educated at the University of London, he became a teacher at Loughborough

College, served in the Royal Navy then returned to Loughborough in 1946 as a Curate and later Vicar at All Saints Church. He held many posts, including Canon Residentiary and Chancellor of Leicester Cathedral, and from 1963 until the 1980s Archdeacon of Loughborough.

Miss Ethel Smith, Died on 27 September 2004. She joined the Department of Engineering in 1966 as a member of the clerical staff, transferred the following year to the Accounts Department where she became Senior Clerk from 1967 until her retirement in 1980.

Mr James Speight, Died on 1 December 2004. He was an Administrative Officer in the School of Biological Sciences in 1974 until he retired in 1982.

Mrs Philippa Stanfield, Died in September 2004. She worked as a secretary primarily in the Department of Physiology from 1978-1989. She was married to Peter Stanfield, former Professor of Physiology.

Dr Wendy Stannard, Died on 14 December 2004 in a car accident. She was an Action Research Trust Clinical Research Fellow and PhD student in the Department of Infection, Immunity and Inflammation.

Dr Harry Vine, Died on 17 April 2004. He joined the University in 1965 as a Lecturer and was promoted to a Senior Lectureship in 1979. He specialised in Soil Science and had an earlier career in Nigeria based on this interest. After his retirement in 1981 he continued using the Soil Laboratory for his research on Nigerian soils.

Mr Dusan (Doug) Vukelic, Died September 2004. He was a Porter in the Charles Wilson Building from 1974-1984 when he was promoted to Senior Porter. He retired in 2001.

Mr Graham Wheat, Died on 17 April 2005. He worked at the University as a Porter from 1997.

Miss Paula Wheatley, Died on 2 March 2005. She was Departmental Secretary (Senior Clerk) in the History Department from 1967 until 1971, then Principal Clerk until her retirement in 1985.

Honorary Graduates

Mrs Joan Goddard, *Honorary Master of Arts 1988*. She died at age 88. She was a keen supporter of the Arts at the University and received her Honorary Degree with her husband Herald.

Sir Robert (Yewdall) Jennings, *Honorary Doctor of Laws 1995*. Died in August 2004. Sir Robert was a noted Judge (1982-95) and President of the International Court of Justice (1991-94). He gave his name to the Chair in International Law.

Dame Alicia Markova, (*Lillian Alice Marks*) *Doctor of Music (Honoris Causa) 1996*. She was probably the greatest British Prima Ballerina and on receiving her degree the Public Orator spoke of her natural perfection, skill and her experience on the stage.

Mr Charles Palmer, *CBE, Honorary Master of Arts 2004*. Died on 2 April 2005. He served the sport of cricket as a player and administrator for more than half a century, playing for England and Leicestershire County, among others. After a distinguished career in county cricket he retired in 1957 and became Chairman of the Club between 1964-1979. During this period he held many posts, including President of the MCC and Chair of the ICC (International Cricket Conference). He was President of Leicestershire Cricket Club between 1986-1993.

Dame Miriam Rothschild, *CBE FRS, Honorary Doctor of Science 1987*. Died on 20 January 2005. She was a passionate conservationist known mainly for her work on fleas and butterflies. She was a self-taught scientist and her research into parasites earned her the title of "Queen of Fleas". She published more than 300 papers on a wide range of subjects and authored the *Catalogue of the Rothschild Collection of Fleas*, that appeared in six volumes over 30 years.

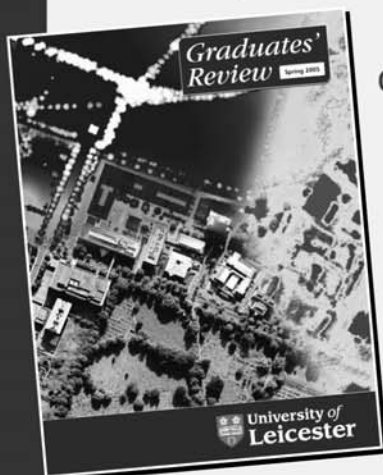
Sir Jean-Pierre Warner, *QC, Honorary Doctor of Laws 1984*. Died on 1 February 2005. Born of an English father and French mother, he became a distinguished lawyer who served as the first British Advocate-General of the European Court of Justice. By anglicising some of the court's procedures he laid the foundations of a bridge between the common law and the civil law traditions. In 1981 when he returned to England he was appointed a High Court Judge in the Chancery until he retired in 1994. He became a bencher of Lincoln's Inn in 1996 and its treasurer in 1985. He was awarded Luxembourg's Grand Cross, Order of Merit in 1998.
