We record with regret the deaths of the following Graduates, Members of Staff, and Honorary Graduates of the University.

Graduates of the University

Mr Alan Beck. Died on 25 August 2006, aged 79. He was a head teacher in Leicestershire from 1963-1990 and former county president of the National Union of Head Teachers.

Dr Violet Bruce, *M Ed Education*, 1963, PhD Education, 1968. Died on 20 November 2006.

Mr Derek Byron, Certificate HE Bird Conservation and Field Ornithology, 2002.

Mr David Chapman, BA Economic and Social History, 1982. Died in December 2006.

Mr Anthony Murles Davis, OBE, BA History, 1952. Died on 4 September 2006, aged 76. At University College he was a member of the Dramatic Society and played football for the University. He organised one of the first football team visits to Germany after WWII. After completing his National Service in the RAF he trained at London University for the Overseas Civil Service. He served in Education in Nyasaland until 1969. On his return to the UK he became the Chief Administrative Officer at Sheffield City Polytechnic and devoted his retirement to raising funds for inner city development with the Diocese of Sheffield, among other voluntary commitments. In 1994, he was awarded the OBE for services to the community.

Dr Anna Goostrey, BSc Genetics, 1995. Died aged 32.
After completing her studies at Leicester, she gained an MSc and PhD at Aberdeen University.

Mr Andy Harris, BA Politics, 1973. Died aged 54. He was a teacher at two inner-city primary schools in Islington between 1975-1981 and was remembered for his commitment to his pupils and his meticulous planning. Between 1981-1985 he represented the constituency of Putney on the Greater London Council (GLC). In 1999 he became head of special and family

services at Wandsworth. He was committed to improving services for all children, particularly those with learning and physical difficulties, and was a great organiser of social events.

Mr Bernard Helliwell, *BSc Economics*, *1959*. Died in March 2006.

Mrs Helen Dorothy Jones, *BSc Sociology, 1970.* Died on 12 October 2006, aged 57.

Mr Simon Lewis, MA Applied Linguistics and TESOL, 2005. Died in March 2006, aged 27.

Air Vice Marshal Alan R Martindale CB, BA History, 1950. Died suddenly on 29 January 2006, aged 76. After a distinguished career in the RAF, he retired in 1985 and was appointed Chief Executive of the Hastings Health Authority, a post held until final retirement in 1990.

Mr Harold Gilbert Orme, MA Victorian Studies, 1983. Died on 21 April 2007, aged 87. After a career in social work with Leicestershire County Council, he completed his MA dissertation at the Victorian Studies Centre on Leicestershire's Lunatics. The Institutional Care of Leicestershire's Lunatics during the Nineteenth Century (the care being in the Fielding Johnson Building). He subsequently remarried Adeline Gorbahn, a German teacher of English and settled at Erlangen. As a young man he had been actively involved in amateur dramatics. writing and producing innumerable plays and in his final retirement he and his wife enjoyed walking holidays all over the world.

February 2006, aged 71. After postdoctoral fellowships at Leicester, Washington State and Oxford Universities, he was appointed Lecturer at Sussex University in 1963 until his retirement. During his career he was an author of some 350 papers and half a dozen books, winner of awards including the RSC Josef Loschmidt prize.

Mr Charles Ward, *BA Modern Language Studies*, *1997*. Died 23 July 2006, aged 80.

Mr Derek Whiteoak, PGCE Education 1991.

Mr Simon Wickham Lewes, MA Applied Linguistics and TESOL, 2005. Died on 29 March 2006.

Mr Paul Winstone, BA Social Sciences, 1973. Died aged 54. After graduation, he worked for Leicester City Council's policy and performance team, where he gained a comprehensive knowledge of local communities and played a vital role in improving race relations in the city. He had worked with the University on several occasions, most recently on a community conference with the Faculty of Law.

Members of Staff

Mrs Caroline Backhouse. She joined the University in September 1986, as an Assistant Manager at Beaumont Hall, and later at Gilbert Murray Hall. She worked at the Residences until June 2000.

Emeritus Professor Olive Banks. Died on 14 September, aged 83. She was the first female professor to be appointed at the University in 1971, as a Reader in Sociology and was awarded a Personal Chair in 1973. One of her many extra duties was to serve on the Gardens Committee in 1971, when news spread of the work that she and her husband Joe did in their garden at Husbands Bosworth. She became Director of Postgraduate Studies in the

department and took early retirement in 1982.

Mr John Berry. Died on 28 February 2007. He worked as a porter at Stamford Hall until his retirement in January 1994.

Mr Ralph Biddles. Died on 12 June 2006. He joined the Department of Physics in July 1966 as a Workshop Technician and was promoted to Senior Technician in April 1972. He took early retirement in September 1987.

Mr Peter Boggon. Died aged 68. He tutored in the Department of Engineering and at the Open University. In his spare time, he designed sets or programmes for the Welwyn Wailers at the Welwyn Garden City Art Club. He was the cartoonist for the Welwyn & Hatfield Times, formerly known as the Welwyn Times, in the 1970s. He died following a two month battle with cancer.

Professor Ray Bolam. Died aged 68. He was a visiting professor at the Centre for Educational Leadership and Management at the University of Leicester and the University of Bath. He made a big contribution to a study on sustaining learning communities in schools.

Emeritus Professor Philip A W Collins. Died on 6 May 2007, aged 83. He was elected to the Chair of English at Leicester in 1964 and served as Head of the Department of English between 1971-76 and 1981-82. Although he took early retirement in 1982 he continued to teach part-time until 1985.

Mr David Hamilton Munro. Died on 21 February 2007. He was formerly a Security Supervisor who retired in September 1984.

Jean Hudson. Died on 20 December 2006. She was a former secretary to Professor Nilesh Samani, British Heart Foundation Professor of Cardiology at Glenfield Hospital. Mrs Rosemary Luke (née Poole). She joined the University in 1992 and served in a number of positions, including Senior Clerk in the Department of Pathology, Principal Clerk in Adult Education and Chief Clerk in the Division of Chemical Pathology (renamed the Department of Clinical Biochemistry in 2002). After the Medical School was restructured in 2003, she was assigned to the Department of Cancer Studies and Molecular Medicine. She left the University in January 2006.

Rev Professor John McManners. He was a Professor of History between 1967-1972, before his appointment to the Regius Chair of Ecclesiastical History in Oxford.

Mr Donal Nicolson, DFM. He joined the University in 1978 as a Staff Supervisor in the Clinical Sciences Building at the Leicester Royal Infirmary and retired in 1989.

Mr George Ottley. He joined the University as an Assistant Librarian in September 1967 and retired in 1977. He was reappointed to the same post on a part-time basis between 1977 until his retirement in 1981.

Emeritus Professor Norman Pye. Died on 16 March 2007, aged 93. He was a Professor and Head of the Department of Geography between 1954-1979. He was an influential figure in overseeing the transformation of the former University College into the University of Leicester in 1957 and in guiding its development during a period of rapid expansion. He was Dean of the Faculty of Science from 1957-1960, Pro-Vice-Chancellor from 1963-1966, and served on innumerable University committees. He also served on the board of the Corby **Development Corporation for** 15 years and on the Northamptonshire Education Committee for 20 years. Professor Pye' is remembered for creating a modern wellequipped teaching and research Geography department; for the department's move to the Bennett Building. He took great satisfaction in seeing student

numbers increase tenfold and staff fourfold during his term of office.

Dr Joan Skinner. Died on 19 March 2006, aged 82. She held a clerical post in the Department of Biochemistry between 1968 until she retired in 1977.

Don Slater. He was a Librarian at the University of Leicester Northampton Centre. He obtained certificates in Local History and Modern Social History at Nene College and went on to complete a degree in Humanities, and later an MA in Historical Studies. After retirement, he continued in his capacity as Librarian at the Northampton Centre for many years.

Dr Robert R Thornton. He served as the University Treasurer between 1981-1985.

Mr Steve Winter. He held several positions at the University between 1980 and 1990 where he ended his career as Head Porter for the School of Education site.

Dr Anne Witz. Died on 12 December 2006. She joined the University in January 2002 as a Reader in Sociology. Before joining the University she held positions at the University of Birmingham in the Department of Social Policy and Social Work and as a senior lecturer in Sociology at the University of Strathclyde. Although she was committed to feminism, and to re-envisioning sociology from a feminist perspective, she was also committed to sociological theory.

Emeritus Professor Derek Wright. He joined the University in September 1962 as a Lecturer in the Department of Psychology, and became Senior Lecturer in 1970 and a Reader in 1974. In 1975 he was appointed to a Chair of Education in the School of Education. Although he retired in September 1982, he returned to the University as an Associate Teacher for three vears between 1982-1985 and served as Director of the Centre for Social and Moral Education in the School of Education for three years.

Honorary Graduates

Sir Malcolm Henry Arnold, CBE, Honorary Doctor of *Music, 1984.* Died on 23 September 2006. He was an English Composer who began his career as a professional trumpeter, but by age thirty he was composing full-time. Bracketed with Britten and Walton he was one of the UK's most sought-after composers. He gained a reputation as a composer of light music but also wrote a number of concertos. Arnold's most significant works are generally considered to be his nine symphonies.

David Campton, Honorary Doctor of Letters, 2006. Died aged 82. Born in Leicester, he gave up a secure job with the Midland Gas Board for a career in writing. His first plays were staged by the Leicester Drama Society and the Vaughan Players. Occasional diversions into acting and directing involved him most notably with Stephen Joseph and the Scarborough Theatre in the Round in its early days. He wrote more than 120 plays including Jonah and Dark Wings, many of which are performed today.

Mr Derrick Dunn, Honorary Master of Arts, 1982. Died on 7 January 2006.

Clive Perry, Honorary Master of Arts, 1967. Died on 11 November 2006, aged 70. He was an important figure in British theatre - in Derby, Leicester, Edinburgh, Birmingham and Pitlochry. He devoted a large part of his career to encouraging creativity and radical experiment in actors, writers, technicians, and directors. At age 26 he owned his own theatre and was the Founding Director of Leicester's Phoenix Theatre – achievements which earned him recognition by the University.

Professor Charles Rees, CBE, FRS. Died on 21 September, aged 78. He was one of the most eminent organic chemists of his generation, specialising in the area of heterocyclic chemistry. He was appointed Professor of Organic Chemistry between 1965-1969 and in 1994 was awarded an Honorary DSc by the University.
