

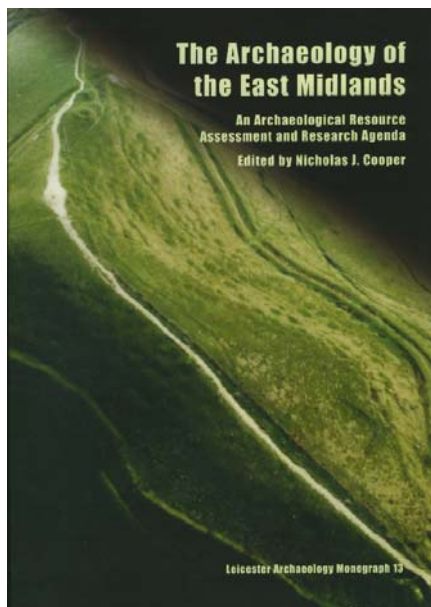

The East Midlands provides a microcosm of the country as a whole, spanning the traditional Highland-Lowland divide. The rich archaeology of the region includes the discovery of Upper Palaeolithic cave art at Creswell Crags, well preserved organic remains in the Fens and valleys of the Trent and Witham, the prehistoric landscapes of Derbyshire, the relict medieval landscapes of Leicestershire and Northamptonshire, the deeply stratified and built archaeology of historic towns and the industrial landscapes of the Derwent Valley – a world heritage site.

This volume summarises our knowledge of each chronological period together with two thematic chapters, focussing on the role of environmental archaeology and broader issues applicable to all periods and how these might contribute to a research strategy. The text is supported by illustrations and an extensive bibliography.

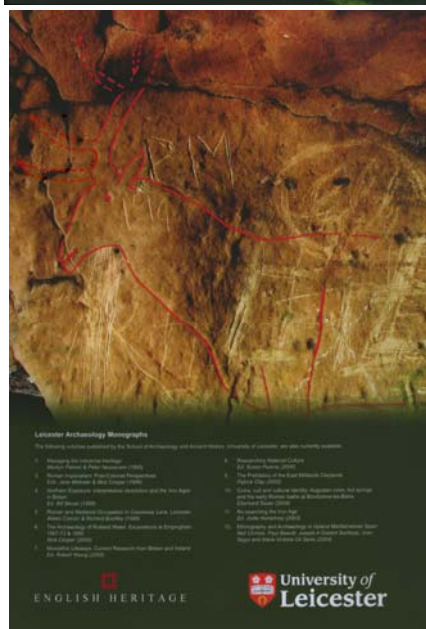
